
PRETRIAL ORDER #106
(Hearing on Emergency Motion to Compel)

Pending before the court is Plaintiffs' Emergency Motion to Compel Defendant American Medical Systems to Produce a Corporate Designee for Deposition Regarding the Transvaginal Mesh Product Elevate Pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 30(B)(6) and Request for Expedited Hearing. (ECF No. 1030). In cases subsequently removed or transferred to this court, a copy of the most recent pretrial order will be provided by the Clerk to counsel appearing in each new action upon removal or transfer. It shall be the responsibility of the parties to review and abide by all pretrial orders previously entered by the court.
