PRETRIAL ORDER # 75
(Emergency Motion for Protective Order)

Pending before the court is the Emergency Motion for Protective Order filed by nonparties, Daniel J. Christensen and MedStar Funding, LC (“Movants”). (ECF No. 663). Movants seek a protective order staying the deposition of Christensen until resolution by a Texas court of an alleged conflict of interest involving counsel for American Medical Systems, Inc. (“AMS”).¹ Movants argue that Christensen will be inconvenienced if required to sit for more than one deposition, which is likely to occur if Boston Scientific Corp. is permitted to schedule Christensen’s deposition before the Texas court has ruled on the conflict of interest. Boston Scientific Corp. filed a response in opposition to the proposed stay. (ECF No. 669). On January 29, 2014, the court heard oral argument on the motion.

Defendant Boston Scientific Corp. represented to the court that it was not involved in the conflict of interest and did not receive confidential information from counsel for AMS. Boston Scientific Corp. argued that given current docket control orders, it wished to promptly proceed with Christensen’s deposition. Therefore, Boston Scientific Corp. asked


¹ Mr. Christensen’s deposition was scheduled and cross-noticed by defendants in five multidistrict litigations (“MDL”) involving pelvic mesh products, including AMS, Bard, Boston Scientific Corp., Ethicon, Inc., and Coloplast, Corp. The alleged conflict of interest involves only counsel in the AMS MDL.

the court to deny the motion for protective order.

Having considered the matter, and noting that Movants supplied no evidence or argument indicating that Boston Scientific Corp. has received confidential information, and further noting that the deposition of Christensen has been pending for several months, the court **DENIES** the Emergency Motion for Protective Order. Counsel for Boston Scientific Corp. is **ORDERED** to work with Movants and counsel for C. R. Bard, Inc., Ethicon, Inc., and Coloplast Corp. (Mentor) to select a convenient date and time in the near future for the deposition of Daniel J. Christensen.

The court **DIRECTS** the Clerk to file a copy of this order in 2:12-md-2326, and it shall apply to each member related case previously transferred to, removed to, or filed in this district, which includes counsel in all member cases up to and including civil action number 2:14-cv-5744. In cases subsequently filed in this district, a copy of the most recent pretrial order will be provided by the Clerk to counsel appearing in each new action at the time of filing of the complaint. In cases subsequently removed or transferred to this court, a copy of the most recent pretrial order will be provided by the Clerk to counsel appearing in each new action upon removal or transfer. It shall be the responsibility of the parties to review and abide by all pretrial orders previously entered by the court.
